### Hosting a Block Party

#### **Connecting with Neighbours**

- Block parties are a fun way to connect with the people in your community
- Our community is growing increasingly diverse, which is a benefit to everyone by providing opportunities to learn about other people. It is important that we build neighbourhoods that are welcoming and inclusive for all people, from different cultures, backgrounds and ways of life.
- Make sure to invite all your neighbours in the area the block party will take place (i.e. the whole cul-de-sac, apartment building, or block).
- Use the provided door hangers to give everyone the information they'll need about the event.

#### Why Connect With Your Neighbours?

Connecting with your neighbours helps increase the wellbeing of everyone involved! A connected neighbourhood helps everyone feel a sense of safety and belonging.



### **Getting Started**

#### **Getting started**

- The idea of a neighbourhood block party is to bring neighbours together. It's a good idea to find 1 or 2 neighbours to help you with the event.
- Decide what type of block party will work best for your neighbourhood
  - Barbecues everyone brings his or her own food;
  - Picnics everyone brings their own meal;
  - Potlucks everyone brings something to share (see page 7 for tips); or
  - A combination of the above.
- Decide where to host your block party
  - $\circ~$  Road block off the road in front of some of the houses on your block
  - Alleyway use the alley behind your houses and include the neighbours on both sides of the alley
  - Driveways or backyards use a driveway or backyard for something a little smaller





#### **General Guidelines**

- Block party time limits are 7:00 am 10:00 pm on weekdays and 9:00 am 10:00 pm on weekends
- Applicant must remain at the party until its conclusion
- Alcoholic beverages are not permitted on Town property
- Firepits must be raised and CSA-approved (see page 12 for application)
- Barricades and the Block Party Activity Kit must be returned on the business day following your event.
- Have a plan for clean-up after the event

### **Road Closure Guidelines**

- The Road Closure Application must be submitted two weeks before your planned event. All applications must be approved by the Town of Vegreville.
- We recommend blocking off only a limited number (2-3) of houses.
- Emergency vehicle access must be maintained at all times during the event (eg. Fire, ambulance or police vehicle/personnel)
- Barricades must be removed immediately after the event ends.



### Planning a Block Party

#### Planning your Block Party

- Mid-May to end of September is a good time to have a block party, but you can always have some winter fun as well.
- A weekend date or holidays are often the best times for the event.
- Have an alternate rainout day planned, just in case.
- Ensure that the party is accessible for everyone, including individuals with mobility challenges.
- Consider who will be attending your celebration; try to host activities that everyone can participate in.
- Encourage intergenerational and intercultural participation. Communities thrive when we all celebrate together, across our lines of identity.
- If your neighbourhood has lots of new families, consider playing "Neighbourhood BINGO" to learn more about each other.



### Tips for Hosting a Block Party

#### Making your Block Party a Success

- Encourage your neighbours to show off their talents for entertainment!
- Pick a variety of activities from our kits to appeal to all ages.
- Make sure to give everyone as much notice as possible.
- Coordinate for everyone to bring their own tables, chairs, plates, cutlery, cups, food and beverages. If using barbecues, who will bring them? Plan ahead!
- Decide if pets are allowed.
- Be ready to oversee the clean up after the event. Consider making someone the waste & recycling coordinator for your event.

### **Food Tips**

- If you're planning for a potluck, encourage everyone to label their dishes with the ingredients and allergens.
- Encourage your neighbours to bring their own food



## Block Party Planning Check List

- Use this checklist to make sure everything is ready for a successful Block Party! Before the Event:
  - Submit your registration form, Block Party Activity Kit form, and all required permits to the Vegreville & District Family & Community Support Services two weeks before planned event
  - Decide what kind of event you're going to host (Barbeque, Potluck, Picnic, etc.)
  - Give out the door hangers to all your neighbours so they can put the date in their calendar as soon as you have your approval
  - Arrange for garbage/recycling bins and clean-up supplies
  - Arrange for any required tables, BBQs, and supplies
  - Pick up the Block Party Activity Kit and the road barricades from the required locations

### On the Day of the Block Party:

- Set-up the barricades, garbage/recycling bins, games, and any required tables/chairs
- Consider having a comment sheet so you know what people liked for next year!
- Have fun!
